

7. S A U J S

A letter from S A U J S was read to the meeting. Arising out of the letter the following points were raised:

- Must explain to them what J.F.J. is.
- A sub-committee of J.F.J. should work under S A U J S.
- Attempts should be made to convince S A U J S to take responsible action on Campus.

8. CONSCRIPTION

It was suggested that a sub-committee be set up to deal with the conscription "problem". Selwyn advised of a meeting that was taking place between himself and the Jewish Chaplain Isadore Rubenstein. An attempt was to be made to get one of the PFP members involved in the Township Monitoring Committee to attend the meeting.

9. J F J POSITIVE INPUT

A discussion was held into what J.F.J. could do within the legal framework of the country. Arising out of the discussion came a decision to bring out a Statement of intent which would set out that the ultimate objective would be to help make South Africa a just society.

It was agreed that a Think Tank session should be held to enable J.F.J. to come to terms with what it could do and achieve.

The next meeting was planned for 9 January 1986 and the meeting closed at 11 p.m.
